Perspectives on inner and outer peace from long-term members of intentional communities in the United States

Intentional communities founded during the counterculture era in the United States (roughly considered to be1965-75) have reached their 40th birthday or beyond. Deborah Altus has carried out interviews with founders and/or long-term residents from several of these communities (e.g., Twin Oaks, Dunmire Hollow, Sandhill Farm, Shannon Farm, Lake Village) about lessons they have drawn about intentional-community living. In particular, on how these long-standing communities -- and long-term communitarians -- have conceptualized and approached working toward inner and outer peace.

Deborah Altus is a professor at Washburn University (Topeka, Kansas, USA). She has studied shared housing arrangements ranging from income-sharing communes to group homes for people near the end of life. She is a former president of the USA-based Communal Studies Association, a board member of ICSA, and is on the editorial boards for Communal Societies and the Fellowship for Intentional Community
